Posters on the Hill (POH) is the Council on Undergraduate Research's (CUR) signature student advocacy event. Each year, 60 participants are selected from approximately 400 applications. Students are invited from all over the country and Puerto Rico to come to Washington, DC to meet with members of Congress and discuss the importance of their particular research, the impact UR has had on their college experience and future educational and career goals, and advocate for the funding of important federal programs that support their work. The COVID-19 health crisis led to the cancellation of the Posters on the Hill 2020 in-person events, but CUR has chosen to honor the spirit of this impressive achievement for all participants by hosting a virtual Posters on the Hill, to take place on Twitter on April 21.
