## Describe your leadership experience both within CUR and extramural.

I have held roles as a higher education administrator for six years. I've held positions as the director of the Office of Undergraduate Research and Fellowships at the George State University Honors College and the assistant dean of students at the University of the District of Columbia. Currently, I am the director of the Center for Undergraduate Fellowships and Research at the George Washington University. I developed as a thoughtful and values-driven leader through these roles. I have also benefitted from professional organization-specific leadership positions in higher education. I joined CUR in 2014 and was selected as a Health Science Division Councilor in 2016. During that time, I served as the vice-chair of the DEI committee. In 2021, I was selected as an Education Division representative. As an Education Division representative, I am on the membership subcommittee and the DEI committee. From 2019-2023, I served on the board of the National Association of Fellowships Advisors and co-founded and chaired the DEI Committee.

# How will your skills help the Council successfully uphold its charge?

At GW, I lead efforts to 1) introduce students and alumni to undergraduate and post-baccalaureate research and fellowship opportunities and 2) provide mentoring and scholar development through the process. I am a diversity, equity, inclusion, belonging, and accessibility scholar. I received my doctoral training in the Educational Psychology program paired with the Certificate in Quantitative Research in Education and the Certificate of Excellence in Teaching and Learning from Georgia State University. Taking an anti-deficit approach, my research, writings, and practice focus on identifying and mitigating barriers to education for college students. My work highlights the necessity of focusing on social mobility, intersectionality, and sense of belonging in learning spaces to develop digital and global citizens. My work has been published in the Global Impact Exchange, the Journal of the National Collegiate Honors Council, and the Journal of Issues in Intercollegiate Athletics.

Since 2017, I have been an active member in the CUR community.
